The Glenrose Hospital Foundation is thrilled to recognize Olivia Terry and Megan Heximer with a National Philanthropy Day Award.

Olivia is a young Glenrose Rehabilitation Hospital patient who has been using a new technology, called brain-computer interface (BCI), to engage with her environment, using only her mind. With BCI, Olivia can drive her wheelchair, play video games, and create art.

Together with her respite worker, Megan, Olivia developed a plan to sell merchandise that has been printed with her BCI-created artwork. The duo started selling hats, t-shirts, and other items to then donate the proceeds back to the Glenrose Hospital BCI program that Olivia has benefitted from.

Their creative endeavour has turned into a powerful force for positive change so that even more kids have access to life-changing technology.




Arts & Culture




Capital Power has been a vocal and steadfast supporter of Boyle Street Community Services and the vulnerable Edmontonians who access the organizations' services for over 10 years.






After seeing their neighbours, friends, colleagues, and members struggling with isolation and a lack of mental health supports in their rural communities, Co-op wanted to find a way that could bring their staff and members together. Since 2020, the campaign has expanded to include 5 Co-op regions, over 85 stores, and has raised over \$135,000 for mental health resources and programs in rural communities across the province from Valleyview to Carstairs. With plans to continue growing this campaign, the Mental Health Foundation is inspired by their growth in fundraising, commitment to improving mental health resources in their communities, and desire to make life better where they live, work, and play.


Jarred Chipchura was one of Boyle Street's first volunteers after the 2022 relaunch and was integral in helping to roll out a new volunteer program.




The Rohit Group of Companies has been a prominent player in residential and commercial development for thirtyseven years, earning recognition for its charitable contributions in Edmonton.





Boyle Street is grateful to honour The Brick for its role in creating a thriving and welcoming space for everyone in Downtown Edmonton.



Youth


